Cylinder head Gasket Failure

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One of our members recently contacted the club Technical Adviser regarding a serious engine malfunction, this members car is a Mk2 Ruby saloon, because this incident occurred during the recent Covid90 pandemic, a house call was not possible. So the only solution I could think of was to conduct question and answer sessions via Facebook messenger and photos.

Here follows the dialogue between us, with CM being the club member and TA being myself.

CM --Could you please give me advice, I recently returned from a short journey with great difficulty because of what I thought was a badly misfiring engine; your advice would be much appreciated.

TA---Your first step would be to establish if the engine is misfiring, to do this, run the engine at normal idling speed, the using a thickly isolated screwdriver, short out in turn each of the spark plugs, if a plug is firing normally the engine speed will drop, if the engine speed does not alter, then that is an indication the cylinder is not firing properly.
CM---I have carried out the tests, and found Nos 3&4 cylinders are not firing properly, shorting Nos 1&2 plugs actually stops the engine, I have fitted new plugs to Nos 3&4 positions without any improvement to the running of the engine, what next please?

TA---Carry out a visual inspection of plug leads and the distributor cap, if these are ok, then the next step will be a cylinder compression test, are you familiar with this procedure?

CM---Not really confident about the procedure, but I do have a good quality compression gauge.

TA---Remove all sparking plugs, place a weighted object on the accelerator pedal to ensure that the carburettor butterfly is fully open, next turn the engine using the starter motor and measure the compression on each cylinder in turn, make a record of the readings.

CM---I successfully carried the procedure and the readings are No1=90psi, No2=95psi, No3=10psi, No4=10psi.

TA---These readings clearly indicate serious problems in Nos 3&4 cylinders, either badly burnt valve seats, or a faulty head gasket. The next step will be to remove the cylinder head, please remember to drain the coolant water and disconnect the battery.

CM---I have sent you a photo of the cylinder block, the head gasket appears to be badly damaged between 3&4 cylinders.

TA---Congratulations, you have now come to the correct conclusion, now proceed with changing the head gasket.

CM----Can you please give me some guide lines?

TA---Yes, the face of the block must be shiny bright, also the cylinder head must be really clean, the head gasket is to be fitted with the beaded edge facing down to the cylinder block, after refitting the cylinder head, use a torque wrench set to 20lbs when engine is cold and repeat when it reaches working temperature.

CM--- Thank you, one last question, if you closely examine the photo, the valves in No 4 cylinder appear to be very clean, do you know what caused this condition?

TA---Yes, I can answer your question, in the early stage of the head gasket failure, coolant water is allowed to enter the cylinder, which then meets the hot gases of combustion which then turns the water immediately into steam, which in turn cleans the valve heads to give them the condition you noticed from the photo. Finally make sure the threads on the head stud & nut are clean and free from oil, otherwise it is possible for the torque wrench to indicate a false reading.
