Waverley Abbey

Waverley Abbey Waverley Lane, Farnham, Surrey, GU9 8EP, located about 2 miles (3.2 km) southeast of Farnham, Surrey

Waverley Abbey in Surrey was the very first monastery founded in Britain by the reforming Cistercian religious order. A small group of monks from France settled in this quiet spot by the River Wey in 1128, and Waverley soon became the springboard for Cistercian settlement in southern England. The abbey was largely demolished in 1536 as part of Henry VIII's dissolution of the monasteries. The impressive remains include the fine 13th century vaulted refectory or dining hall for the lay brothers, the Cistercians' labour force.

Don't miss the chance to see Waverley Abbey's impressive Yew, a spectacular ancient tree growing in the grounds. Whilst its exact age is unknown, it is likely to have watched over the abbey grounds since shortly after the Dissolution of the Monasteries.

In more recent times, the abbey has been used as a backdrop to the films *Elizabeth* (1998) and

Disney's Into the Woods (2014).

NHAEG had a dedicated parking area in front of Waverley Abbey college where lunch and snacks were also available. Please note that some walking is required to visit the ruins.



Dogmersfield fete

There were well over one hundred classic cars at the Dogmersfield fete on Saturday 18th July and NHAEG showed 6 cars, other club members also came in modern cars. The fete show ground had farm animals and birds of prey, together with sideshows and stands showing crafts and rural skills. Many charity stalls were present with books, plants and bric-a-brac plus the usual children's amusements. Traditional teas and refreshments were also available.
