The Nightjar 2019





The following Nightjar story was kindly submitted by Tony Westhall:

I normally do the Nightjar in The Duchess – 1936 12/6 Ascot – but she was poorly. I went out for the day to the seaside a couple of weeks ago and had a lovely drive down there in the sunshine. As I came out of the car park on the way back, there was a nasty knocking sound from the back axle. I had a look underneath and couldn't see anything amiss so drove carefully on. The noise was only when my foot came off the accelerator. All was perfectly OK when driving forwards or putting the clutch in so I carefully drove home. I had a spare complete axle so I changed it over. It sounds simple but it is a 2 person job and the flanges were a different size so a bit of adapting was required. When fitted and taking it on a drive, a nasty screeching came when travelling over 30mph so it was not going to be suitable for the Nightjar. I checked the weather forecast and saw that it was due to be dry so I took the Newbury as this was the most suitable.

I turned up at Old Basing Village Hall just outside Basingstoke after a cold drive, even with the sidescreens in! There were a few cars there – a couple of Austins, an Alvis Speed Twenty, a couple of Rileys and a Morris. My navigators were Derek Ball and Peter Martin so I chatted to a few people and waited for them to arrive.

We had a team of three cars and the only other team was Riley as you need three cars to form a team in these events. The other members were Andy Ranson from Weymouth and Andy Docherty from Guildford. We were also expecting Peter Winney from Bath but a phonecall from his navigator Geoff Pickard told us that he had broken down with fuel troubles and returned home.

We got our instructions at the appointed time and began plotting. We had to plot a series of map references to find the 6 manned and 6 unmanned checkpoints. We had to select 9 to visit so those on the extremities were omitted, even though they scored most points. We set off full of enthusiasm for the first checkpoint – a manned one. We found the spot easily and were given our puzzle to solve that would take us to the location of the white board with the name of a bird written on it. We had a series of bearings with distances to pace given in roman numerals. All quite straightforward but despite being in the right place as there were plenty of others there, we just could not find the board! We gave up at this point and went on to the next checkpoint.

This was an unmanned one with an added note telling us to go to the right of Dexter. These are supposed to be easy to find at the given map reference but not a bit of it. After scouring the carpark I saw a notice board through a gate. On going to investigate there was a picture of a Dexter cow. Ah, we thought, here we are and went searching for the board. No sign of it to the right of the noticeboard. On looking at the noticeboard I saw a picture of a bird to the right of the cow - stonechat – so we put that down. We spent a lot of time on this and were losing our enthusiasm but at least it was not raining!

We went on to the next checkpoint which was a manned one. We got the clue sheet and could not make any sense of it. We told the marshal we were not going to do it and he gave us some help. It began to make some sense and took us on a route through the woods. We got to the end but couldn't find the bird. We thought that this was getting ridiculous but we did one more and found the bird. We then felt better and continued on, finding the birds at all our other destinations. We were short on time by now so we just collected our points for visiting the manned locations and made our way back to the hall.

Others had found it hard as well, which made us feel better. The welcome supper of fish and chips arrived, the results announced (Rileys won) and we all made our chilly way home.

Thanks to Richard Long and his team of helpers for putting on the event. It takes a great deal of hard work and organisation to put this event on and it all went very well. A tribute to them all.

Nightjar update

Following a review of the Nightjar costs and revenues, the Committee is pleased to announce that we made a good profit which is a great achievement. The club will therefore be making a donation to a local charity to be agreed at the AGM in January.

The push on promoting the event paid off by attracting new competitors and also increasing the number of entrants to 28. A tight control on costs was maintained without detracting from the quality of the Nightjar and the addition of the ATDC support for the raffle along with the generous donation from Andrew Barker significantly increased the quality of the prizes. The ATDC have already committed to supporting future events.

The committee expresses its thanks to all those that helped in making this a successful event and hopes that you will be encouraged to come back again next year to have another go. Without your support we can't run this event and next year will be the 45th anniversary of the Nightjar and so will be a special occasion.
