#### **PAYMENT METHODS AVAILABLE**

Some members have reported problems when trying to make online payments to the club, particularly around the account holder name which some of the banks suggest does match the sort code / account number details, this is the banks way of helping to prevent fraudulent transactions. The clubs account details are as follows:

There may be some instances where the bank will restrict the number of characters you can enter for the account name. In this case use NHAEG and it should work, but the bank may warn you that this account name is not recognised. However, as long as you have entered the correct sort code and account number as above, payment will still come through to the club.

### **Club Tools for Loan**

The following article is a re print from a previous bulletin, but if you are planning future work on your vehicle this may be useful information.

The policy, which has been in place for a number of years now, but has rarely actually been exercised, is for anyone wishing to borrow tooling, to lodge a deposit cheque for £25.00 with Don (Breakspear) to cover 2 weeks free hire of the tooling, etc. If the tool is returned within the 2 weeks the cheque is handed back to the user; if it is retained for more than 2 weeks, a charge of £5.00 per week is then levied and any balance returned in due course. There has never been any distinction drawn between tooling; the charge has applied to everything available. All the tools are stored at Breakspear Farm, Finchampstead village. ## Red Wheel Marks Post War Aviation Boom - Friday 26th January 2024

One of the lesser known airfields in Southern England saw the post war birth of the independent aviation sector after the Second World War. This fascinating heritage will be celebrated with a National Transport Trust Red Wheel at an unveiling at 11.00 on Friday 26th January 2024 by His Majesty the Kings Representative, the Lord Lieutenant of Hampshire Nigel Atkinson Esq.

Blackbushe Airport was established in 1942 as RAF Hartford Bridge. After the war, it became London's second airport, the home of independent airlines such as Eagle, Airwork, and Hunting Clan. A huge industry grew out of Blackbushe which straddled the A30 trunk road with traffic lights stopping vehicles to allow aircraft to cross. In the late 1950s the decision was made to

close Blackbushe in favour of the newly built Gatwick Airport. In 1960 all infrastructure was removed, leaving just the tarmac, and the Terminal Building, which was built in 1953.

The Red Wheel is to be located next to the airport's Executive Lounge and they have kindly offered light refreshments following the event.

Blackbushe Airport is just off the A30, south west of Camberley. The postcode is GU17 9LQ, What3Words: broke.trophy.gain.
