Know your tyres:

An important safety factor is the age of our car tyres. There is a move to recommend that tyres are replaced irrespective of wear or apparent good condition after 10 years. The ageing of tyres is difficult to notice in normal driving conditions until suddenly presented with a situation that demands more grip! Dating can easily be done by reading sidewalls (note date mark is only on one sidewall and could be on the inside). Since 2000 a four digit code has been used e.g. 2704 indicates the tyre was made in week 27 of 2004.

Before 2000 just three numbers were used e.g. 179 indicates the tyre was made in week 17 of 1999
