

QUERIES OF THE MONTH


Some more "Queries of the Month", these originally appeared in "The Austin Magazine & Advocate" during the 1930s and 1940s. This month's selection consists of No 478 Washing Car – Austin Twelve-Six and No 712 Battery in Stored Car.

No 478 appeared in March 1933 and No 712 in January 1936.

No 478 - Washing Car - Austin Twelve-Six

Q. In washing my Austin Twelve-Six I have several times caused water to penetrate to the engine. Is this likely to cause harm, and should I wash the bonnet by some other means than by direct by hose.

A. Water in the engine may cause erratic running, through shorting the high-tension ignition current, or, though less likely, through getting into the carburetter.



It is a wise plan to keep handy a piece of waterproof sheeting, or American cloth, which can be placed over the engine inside the bonnet to protect the power unit from water entering through the bonnet louvres whilst using the hose.

Further, when washing the car, always avoid directing the hose at the radiator surface, as the water can then pass directly through the air spaces onto the engine.


(NHAEG note: The definition of American Cloth is a glazed or waterproof cotton cloth.)

No 712 - Battery in Stored Car

Q. I shall be obliged if you would give me detailed information as to how I can keep my battery in an efficient state during the time I am laying up the car.

A. The battery must be fully charged before you lay your car up. A fully charged battery will stand for several months without damage, whereas a partly charged or a discharged battery will rapidly deteriorate as a result of sulphation. Ensure that the level of the electrolyte is above the plates and that the battery top is perfectly clean and dry, as moisture or dirt give rise to a continuous leak of current which, though small, will in time fully discharge the battery.

The battery leads should be disconnected as a further safeguard against current leakage, and the battery will then stand over winter, providing that a refresher charge is given, say, every month or two.



This can be done after connecting up the battery leads, by running the engine to bring the dynamo into operation.
