Events that you may have missed last month

Despite the bad weather there was a good turn out at the February club night when Alan P gave an excellent presentation on his work with the Albella boys charity.



Where is Albella? The Boys Home is in the far north east of India, at Kalimpong, Darjeeling district. Kanchenjunga, the world's third highest mountain, can be seen from the home but Everest is hidden. The altitude is 4500 feet, requiring warm clothes in the cold winter November to March, but unlike Darjeeling, a three hour jeep ride away, the temperatures never fall below zero and it never snows.

For over 50 years, Albella's mission has been to care for under-privileged children by providing free boarding, lodging, clothing, education and medical assistance, irrespective of cast, creed or race. To bring up such children in the knowledge of God and instill the dignity and honour of all kinds of work to make them better citizens of India.

Albella Boys Home and school are run on Christian values by an all-Indian staff, mostly Gurkhas, happily co-existing with the predominantly Hindu culture of the region. Albella gives free education to over 240 boys, mostly aged 5-19, having lost one parent, and sometimes both.



At the end of the evening, the club made a donation of £70.00 to the Albella boys home.

Murder – Mystery Event

Also in February a number of NHAEG, and ATDC members attended a Murder Mystery event at the Audley Wood Hotel, just south of Basingstoke.
