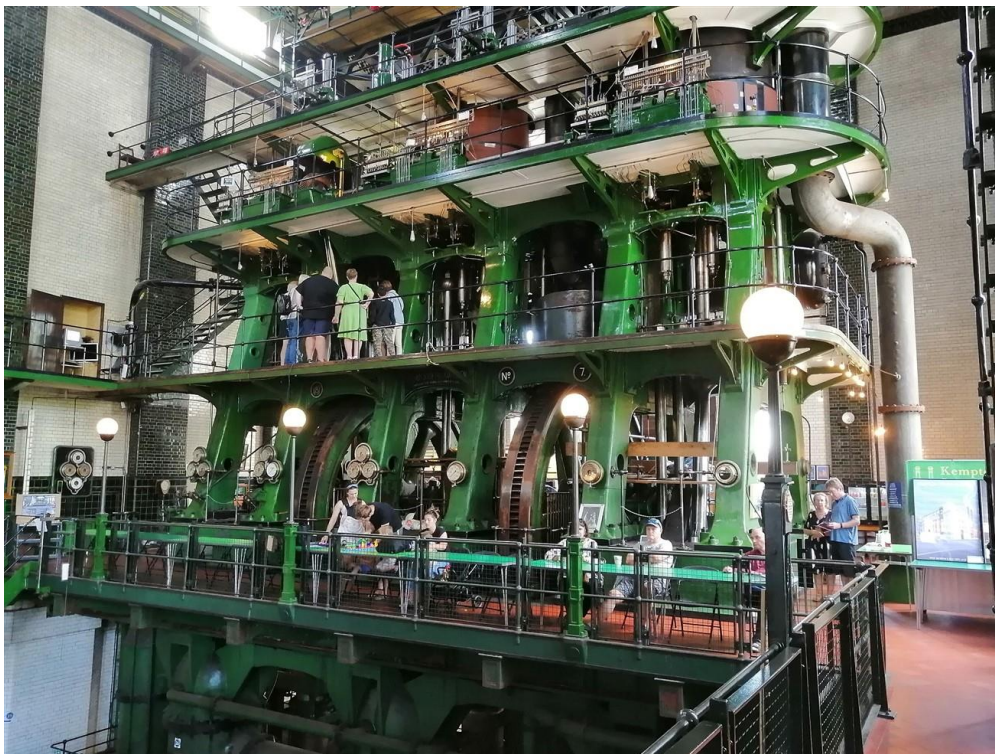
Hinton Ampner allowed us to park our classic cars in front of the house.



Kempton Steam Museum

Kempton Steam Museum is the home of the world's largest working triple-expansion steam engine known as 'The Sir William Prescott Engine'. The engine sits amongst two steam turbines and opposite an identical twin called 'The Lady Bessie Prescott Engine,' which is currently being restored. The machines are as high as four stacked double-decker buses and closely resemble the RMS Titanic's engines.

6 intrepid members of NHAEG went to the Kempton Steam Museum on 20th August when the engine was running on that day. The guided tour which lasted about 1 hour made the tour very worthwhile.
