Science & Innovation Park

The committee are considering organising a group visit to the Science & Innovation Park, Wroughton, SN4 9LT (near Swindon). The 90-minute tour takes place at 13.30 on Fridays and costs £25 pp.

The Science and Innovation Park is a 545-acre former RAF airfield near Swindon. With stunning native woodlands, extensive runways and hangars as well as one of the UK's largest solar farms, the site plays a vital role in the Science Museum Group's sustainability activities as well as hosting a range of research and development projects and commercial activities. At the heart of the Science and Innovation Park is the Hawking Building, home to around 80% of the Science Museum Group Collection.

The dedicated tours for organised adult groups of the Hawking Building give visitors the chance to discover game-changing objects from history and allow members of the public to get up close to our world-class collection of objects from science, technology, engineering, medicine, transport and media.

HAWKING BUILDING

At the Hawking Building we care for hundreds of thousands of objects in the Science Museum Group Collection. In 2018, we embarked on an ambitious project to create this new purpose-built facility, transform how we care for museum objects and enable people to explore much more of the Collection than ever before. More than 300,000 historic objects have now been carefully moved to this sector-leading facility, bringing together these historic objects under one roof for the first time for conservation, study and public access.

Electrolytic Rust Removal

ELECTROLYTIC RUST REMOVAL

CLEAN RUST OFF NUTS, BOLTS & PARTS THE EASY WAY!

WHAT YOU NEED

- CONTAINER**
Plastic bucket or storage tote (never metal)
- POWER SUPPLY**
• 12V DC battery charger or DC power supply
• 2–10 amps for best results
- ELECTROLYTE**
• Washing soda (sodium carbonate) – RECOMMENDED
• Baking soda works but is less effective
• 1 Tbsp washing soda per gallon of water
- SACRIFICIAL ANODE (POSITIVE +)**
Use mild steel:
• Flat steel plate
• Rebar
• Steel angle iron
Do NOT use stainless or galvanized steel!
- WIRING**
• Alligator clip leads
• Heavy gauge wire if using multiple anodes
- HARDWARE SUSPENSION**
• Copper wire, steel wire
• Plastic rod or wooden dowel across the tank
• Parts must NOT touch the anode

WHAT A SETUP LOOKS LIKE

POSITIVE (+) To Sacrificial Steel (Anode)

NEGATIVE (-) To Rusty Part (Cathode)

HOW IT WORKS
Electric current causes rust (iron oxide) to leave the part (cathode) and move to the sacrificial anode. The good metal is not removed—only the rust!

IDEAL FOR CLASSIC CAR PARTS

NOT RECOMMENDED FOR

- Aluminum
- Zinc Die-Cast (Pot Metal)
- Brass
- Heavily Plated Parts

AFTER CLEANING

- REMOVE PART**
Rinse with water.
- DRY THOROUGHLY**
Use compressed air or a heat gun.
- PROTECT IMMEDIATELY**
Apply oil or rust preventative while part is still warm.

RUST PREVENTATIVES

- WD-40
- Fluid Film
- Boeshield T-9
- LPS 3

STEPS

- Mix electrolyte in the container.
- Connect **POSITIVE (+)** to the sacrificial anode.
- Connect **NEGATIVE (-)** to the rusty part.
- Suspend the part in the solution—do NOT let it touch the anode.
- Turn on the power.
- Let it run. Check progress every 30–60 minutes. Time depends on rust level (a few hours to overnight).
- Remove part, rinse, dry, and protect immediately.

WIRING DIAGRAM

+ – (Positive)
Battery Charger → Sacrificial Steel (Anode)

Washing Soda Solution
→ Rusty Part (Cathode)
– – (Negative)

ELECTROLYTE MIXTURE

1 TABLESPOON WASHING SODA PER GALLON OF WATER

1 TBSP + 1 GALLON WATER = ELECTROLYTE SOLUTION

CLEANING SUPPLIES

- Wire brush
- Brass brush
- Scotch-Brite pads
- Toothbrushes
- Plastic scraper

OPTIONAL UPGRADES

- Multiple anodes for even cleaning
- Timer to shut off automatically
- Aquarium pump for circulation
- Adjustable power supply for precise current control

SAFETY FIRST!

- Wear safety glasses and rubber gloves.
- Work in a well-ventilated area.
- Hydrogen gas is produced—keep sparks and flames away!
- Do not smoke near the setup.
